

EMIL SCHWARTZ--OBITUARY

After a lingering illness extending over a year Emil Schwartz, aged 79 years, died at the family home five miles northwest of Oelwein, Saturday morning.

Mr. Schwartz was one of the pioneers of the country and for many years lived near Oelwein.

His mental faculties were keen and alert to the last and he enjoyed reading and visiting with old friends.

Emil Schwartz was born Jan. 1, 1856 at Lenzin, Germany. He was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Frederick and Dora Schwartz. He was baptized and confirmed in the Lutheran faith. As a small child he came with his parents to America settling in Dubuque county, later moving to Fayette county where he spent the remainder of his life as a prominent farmer.

He married Miss Emma Thorman Dec. 8, 1885. Unto this union were born seven children, three sons and four daughters. His wife and one daughter having preceded him in death, also one brother and three sisters. He leaves to mourn his loss the following children: Mrs. Minnie Jipson, Mrs. Rose Kauten, Albert Schwartz and William Schwartz, all of Oelwein and Mrs. Ella Klinge of Garner, Iowa, and Mr. Walter Schwartz now in the hospital at Independence, also one brother Richard of Minnesota. Surviving besides the children are thirteen grandchildren and two great-grandchildren and a host of relatives and friends.

Funeral services were held at the Hintz Funeral Home, Tuesday afternoon at 2 o'clock, conducted by Dr. L. W. Hauter in the presence of a large number of relatives, neighbors, and friends. Burial in Oakdale cemetery.
